Flanagan Professors receive a summer salary supplement and up to \$17,000 to support a graduate assistant during each of the three years of the appointment.

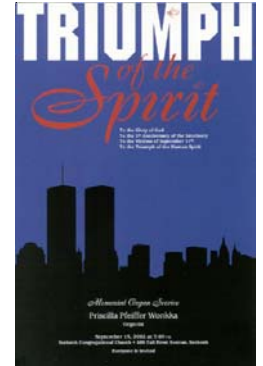

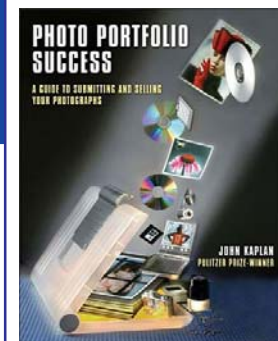
