

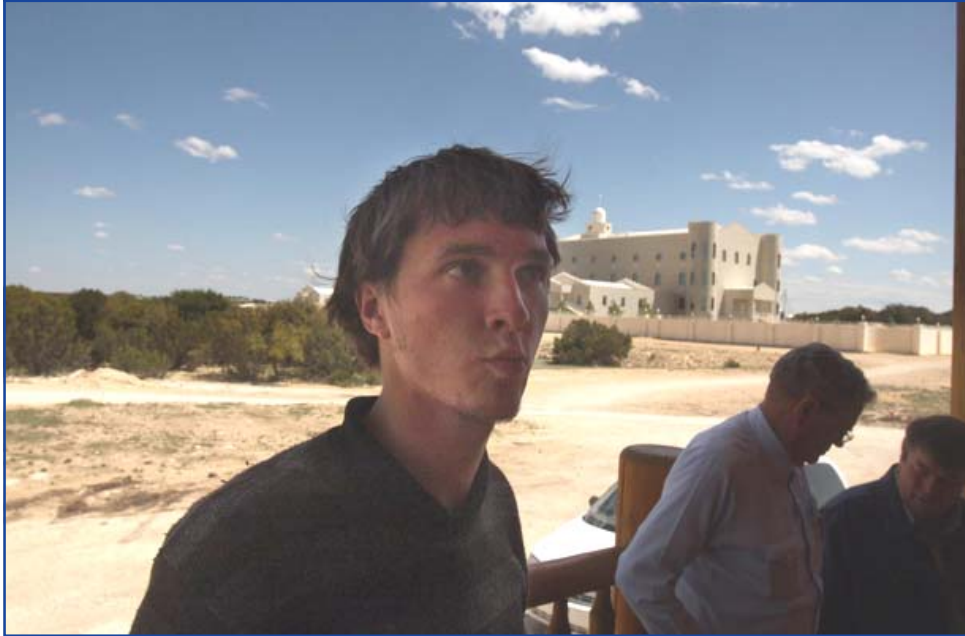

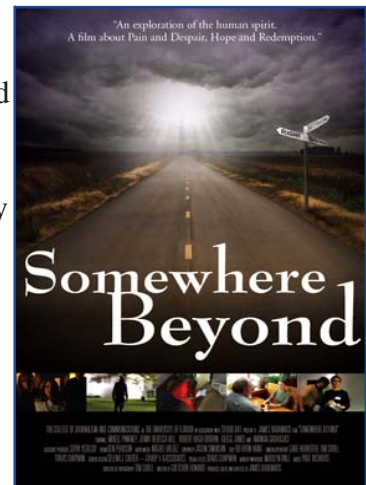
Babanikos, Sorel film premieres
