

RTV 4930: Exploring Greece

Course objectives: Although our focus will be on Greece, and more specifically Crete, this course will more broadly cover what it means to explore a new place. This course is for anyone interested in delving deeper into our host nation's culture and maximizing personal growth through travel. We'll explore our new surroundings thoughtfully while respecting the people and culture.

Topics will include:

- Crete: geography and history
- Crete: a mix of cultures
- Helpful phrases in the Greek language
- Athens geography and history
- Greek and Cretan cuisine
- Exploring on foot and using public transportation
- Situational awareness and observing a place

This course will consist of online readings/viewings, classroom lecture and discussion, and some "outside of the classroom" meetings during scheduled class times. Students will also complete five assignments outside of class, which will be described on Canvas.

As we only meet in person seven times during our trip, attendance and punctuality are mandatory. The general policy for all study abroad classes is a missed class means a loss of a full letter grade. Being tardy (5+ minutes) to class is the loss of a half letter grade. In addition to our

face-to-face meetings in London and Crete, we will have two scheduled Zoom meetings before we leave, and one additional Zoom meeting upon our return.

Quizzes: at the beginning of three of our in-class meetings, we will have a short (unannounced) quiz covering the lecture/discussion from the previous class meeting. Any portion of the quiz missed due to tardiness will result in a loss of credit for that portion of the quiz, so please be on time!

Reflection Paper (General for Study Abroad, not just our class)

As part of your Study Abroad experience you will write and submit a two-page (550-word minimum) reflection paper. The student you are now is not the same person who left a few weeks ago. You've had many incredible moments packed into a short span of time and little downtime to think about it all. Taking time to reflect on your experience is important.

Your reflection paper must answer the following questions:

- What did you discover about yourself?
- How can you extend this experience into a professional setting?
- Discuss the people you met along your journey.
- What surprised you the most about your experience?
- What did you learn from a challenging situation you faced?

550+ words, double-spaced, 12pt font.
