Course Description:

Students will learn the theory and technique of digital film and video editing. Through practical lessons, students will develop editing proficiency with Adobe Premiere Pro editing software.

- 1. Students will develop professional-level skills as a Video Editor.
- 2. Students will become proficient with Adobe Premiere Pro.
- 3. Students will edit three short film projects.
- 4. Students will complete the course with the ability to start and finish the editing of multiple types of film and video projects.
