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Course Description: Supervised assignment of a reporter and anchor for the WUFT Midday and WUFT First at 5 newscasts. Requires between four and eight hours per week in the newsroom.

Prerequisite: To qualify for JOU 4201, students must successfully audition and be approved to join the course by the instructor.

Textbook

There is no required textbook, but it is recommended you purchase the latest version of the AP Stylebook.

Course Details

You will report and/or anchor for WUFT Midday and First at 5 newscasts each week.

Midday anchors will produce weekly VOSOTS to air during First at 5, and First at 5 anchors will produce two packages to be aired during the fall semester. Enterprise reporters will produce unique stories for the North Central Florida audience, focusing on live shots and/or active standups.

Course Learning Objectives

By the end of this course, students will be able to exhibit the following skills and abilities:

- Writing news stories using Associated Press style techniques as a guide
- Ability to capture usable video and audio for television
- Can demonstrate newsworthy values in providing story details
- Ability to execute research in the newsgathering process.
- Developing a unique on-air presence to capture audiences' attention

Anchor Critique Sessions

Students will schedule a session to review their work during the semester. One session will take place prior to the homecoming break, and the last session will take place after the Thanksgiving break.

Grading

You are graded on the skills you exhibit and improvements throughout the semester. Work to get better each show you are involved in so that your broadcast will become free of mistakes and conversational. We will go over critiques immediately following the end of the broadcast but will have more detailed critiques during our one-on-one sessions.
